founded in 1960, has emerged as a premier teaching institution, an economic engine and a research powerhouse with a strong commitment to public service.



Most recently, in August 2013, President Barack Obama selected UC San Diego chemistry professor Mario Molina to receive the Presidential Medal of Freedom, the highest civilian honor bestowed by the United States government.

Molina is an international leader in developing science and environmental policy, particularly as it relates to urban and regional air pollution and climate change. In 1995 he shared the Nobel Prize in chemistry for revealing that common household chemicals were harming the Earth's ozone layer.



In all, 90 current faculty, including Chancellor Pradeep K. Khosla, are members of one or more of the three prestigious national academies: the National Academy of Sciences (43), the National Academy of Engineering (18) and the Institute of Medicine (29). And exceptional innovators such as former faculty member Irwin Jacobs, co-founder of Qualcomm Inc. and National Medal of Technology and Innovation recipient, have shaped and led the campus.

These brilliant individuals help make UC San Diego a preeminent student-centered, research-focused, service-oriented public university. Our 30,000 students and 151,000 alumni advance UC San Diego's local and global impact. More than 650 companies—which generate an estimated \$26 billion in annual sales in the San Diego region—have been launched by or utilize technology produced by UC San Diego faculty, staff and alumni.
